2016 Chardonnay Central Coast

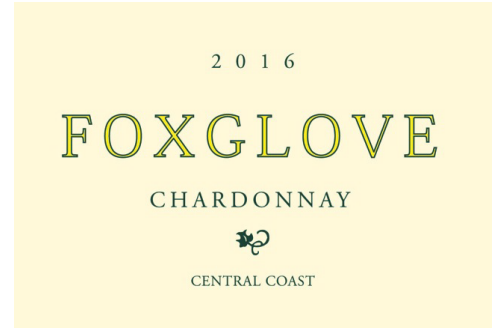
100% Chardonnay, 96% Los Alamos Santa Barbara County, 4% Paso Robles Clone 4 and Dijon Clones, vines between 13 and 33 years old, 630-1,000 ft elevation Vertical Shoot Positioned Canopy, Planted on rolling hills of sandy loam and loam soils Stainless steel 62°, 3 week fermentation, lees stirred, no malo-lactic fermentation

13.8% Alcohol, 0.64 TA, 3.59 pH, .03 RS

“The 2016 Chardonnay is fabulous. In this vintage, the Chardonnay is especially broad, with plenty of tropically leaning fruit, peach and apricot flavors. Lees stirring adds textural richness, but the malolactic fermentation is blocked. The 2016 was not bottled at the time of my tastings, as the Varners wanted to give the wine more time on its lees. Quite simply, this is one of the best values in California

80% Zinfandel, 20% Petite Sirah, 100% Paso Robles, 25 year average age of vines Northern area of Paso Robles, planted on rolling hills, loam soils, 900-1,000 ft elevation 100% destemmed, pressed at dryness, malo-lactic completed after pressing

14.5% Alcohol, 0.54 TA, 3.90 pH, .01 RS

“The 2015 Zinfandel is bright, refreshing and full of energy. Sweet red cherry fruit, floral notes and tobacco are all given an extra kick of aromatic and acid-driven brightness Medium in body and lithe, the 2015 delivers serious quality for the money Don't miss it”

2016 Cabernet Sauvignon Paso Robles

100% Cabernet Sauvignon, 100% Paso Robles, 20 year average age of vines Northern area of Paso Robles planted on rolling hill, loam soils, 900-1,000 ft elevation 100% destemmed, pressed at dryness, malo-lactic completed after pressing

14.5%, 0.56 TA, 3.90 pH, .05 RS
